For no apparent reason Reece stopped talking about 3 years ago making it very difficult for schooling and home life. <br> He was chosen to go riding and hoped it would be something he would enjoy - on his first session he was lead by an Instructor who knew nothing of his problem - after a while he was obviously enjoying himself she asked him if he wanted to trot and he nodded - she told him he would have to sayTROT ON to the pony and after repeating this a few times he quietly said TROT ON and they carried on with the lesson - just with a few words like good boy, stop, go etc - The teachers were astonished and his foster parents overjoyed and he continues to talk and his best friend is now SADIE the pony!

Students from Glenrothes School in Scotland who attend the Positive Diversions Project made a short video about their experiences riding and caring for horses. The pupils and CarolWilson - project manager spent a considerable time on this and produced a very professional video that can be viewed on our website .
"When I started at TLG I saw R as a very quiet, withdrawn young man. He often hid under a cap with his eyes downcast. He never sat next to people in lessons and just quietly got on with his work without interacting with anyone. He'd be huddled in his hoodie or coat with his head and face barely seen. And then we took him horse riding

I had to do a double take! Suddenly, there on the back of a horse was a completely different boy. He was talking to the horse and stroking him. His head was up and I could not only see his face, but could see him SMILING! He was not the sad, withdrawn lad that l'd seen before. He came alive and really enjoyed himself. Even though none of the other lads went and it was only girls, he asked to go back every week.
Seeing $R$ in the country fresh air, just him and his horse having a wonderful time, gave me a new insight as to just what can be offered to these young people. It's not just about academic education and passing exams it's also about providing these troubled young people with the opportunity to try new things ... to succeed in things that they didn't know they could even do ... to grow in confidence to experience, love, grace, forgiveness and acceptance even when they mess up ... and to be happy."

PUPILS from a Cleethorpes school are riding high after achieving top marks in their favourite subject.
Holy Family Catholic Academy (HFCA) is the first school in the area to offer its pupils the chance to take exams in horsemanship.
The riding experience at Weelsby Park Riding School has been enjoyed thanks to a partnership between the Cleethorpes school, the riding centre andThe Emile Faurie Foundation, which sponsors young riders.
